

A couple of special notes. Throughout the year, if an opportunity presents itself to take a photo that might be considered a **photojournalism** opportunity, take it. On Monday, March 9, our program will be on Photojournalism. Also, notice that we will spend a couple of days in Southern Illinois in late October. Finally, keep in mind that the I-74 topic for the new year is H₂O. For more details on all of these, see the schedule below.

The schedule below is subject to change. The categories and dates for competitions are firm. We expect to again be able to meet in Turner

Hall but will not have confirmation until August.

All categories in our digital competitions are to be treated as being photo-realistic except for those that are explicitly noted below; however, photo-realistic images may be entered in any of the categories that allow more strongly manipulated images. As a reminder, a **Photo-Realistic Digital Image** is a digital image in which the original photographic content predominates. While alteration of the image by the maker is permitted, the alteration should not predominate or be obvious. **Blending of images from different scenes is prohibited**.

Monday, September 15, 7:30 PM. Get (Re)Acquainted Night. Bring up to 20 images (preferably digital, but prints are also welcome) to share with others.

Monday, September 29, 7:30 PM. This evening will have two parts. Part I.

Converting to Black and White, presented by Jim Long. Jim will talk about methods of converting color images to B&W images using Photoshop. Part II. Image Critique. Each member of the Club is invited to bring one or two images to be critiqued by other Club members. Club members will talk about the strengths and weaknesses of each image, and will discuss ways to make the image stronger. Members are urged to consider making changes to their images based on the critique and show those modified images at the October 27 meeting.

Monday, October 13, 7:30 PM. Digital Competition. Categories are A.

Windows/Doors. B. Flora. C. B&W (General category). Each member may submit up to four images per category. For purposes of the digital competition at this meeting, members may consider Category B Flora as a non-photo realistic Category. For the annual Salon, Flora will remain a photo-realistic category.

Friday, Saturday and Sunday, October 24-26. Trip to Southern Illinois, Shawnee National Forest. Mary Cattell is investigating the availability of rooms at a Best Western in Ullin, Illinois. Most members present at the planning session suggested they will probably arrive on Friday and depart on Saturday or Sunday. More on this trip will be discussed once the Club starts meeting in September, but people may wish to make room reservations once we hear back from Mary. The photos taken on this trip will form the subject of our meeting on February 9.

Definitions of Salon Categories:

A: Landscapes and/or Waterscapes. Hand of man should appear minimally in these images. B: People. Any aspect of human activity featuring one or more persons. This category includes portraits of people. C: Fauna. Includes both wild and domesticated fauna. D: Flora. Includes both wild and domesticated flora. E. Architecture. Can be an image showing small architectural details up to a large number of structures, including buildings and bridges and other man-made structures.

F: General. Anything.

G: Contemporary/Creative. Images should have a contemporary or creative feeling. This is the primary category for strongly manipulated, very drastically altered digital

images, although such images may also be entered in F, General.

Make sure Jim Long has your images by 7 PM on April 17. This will be discussed as we get closer to the Salon dates.

Print judging 10 AM. Lunch approximately Noon. Digital Image Judging 1:30 PM. Dinner with judges, 5:30 PM. Showing of prints and digital images with comments from judges, 7 PM.

Wednesday, April 29, 7PM. Annual Business Meeting and selection of images for I-74 Challenge. We will also plan our program for the next Club year.



This year's I-74 Challenge between the Bloomington-Normal Koda Roamers and the Champaign County Camera Club was held in Bloomington on May 16 at the National City Bank Center. The category for the competition was Patterns. Each club submitted 50 images. All of CCCC's images were submitted digitally. The heavy majority of KR's images were ditgital, and Meng Horng, who projected the competition, earlier converted the KR slide entries to digital. Thirty-four images scored 22 or more points. 

Rules for 2009 I-74 Competition

- 1. A digital image must be Photo-Realistic. This is a digital image in which the original photographic content predominates. Alteration of the image by the maker is permitted, but the alteration should not predominate or be obvious. Blending of images from different scenes is prohibited, e.g., a photo with a white sky cannot have a blue sky from a different photo dropped in.
- 2. Minor edits are allowed. For example, one can modestly use cropping, levels, curves, saturation adjustments, sharpening, contrast, brightness, dust removal, etc. from Photoshop. Sharpening the image is allowed, but over-sharpening will most likely result in an image that fails to look photo realistic. A color photo may be converted to B&W. Cloning is allowed but only to remove minor elements.
- 3. Images from two different scenes cannot be combined to get a new image.
- 4. Blending of images is permissible if the camera remains stationary and records the same scene for each capture. An example for this approach would be capturing a sunset with a high contrast between the background and foreground. By shooting the same scene with different exposures and then blending in properly exposed areas from the appropriate image captures, results can be obtained that are similar to a graduated neutral density filter.
- 5. The use of fancy filters, e.g., twirling, spherical coordinates, etc. is not allowed. Application of any filter that results in an unrealistic image is not allowed.
